This is the Year of the Swallowtail Butterfly

Spring is Here and so are the Swallowtails!

You may have already seen a few Spicebush, Black or Pipevine Swallowtail, but the most common swallowtail is the Eastern Tiger Swallowtail and it is also our state butterfly. We are fortunate to live where swallowtails are so prevalent.

Eastern Tiger Swallowtails are large butterflies and there are two adult forms; the characteristic yellow form and the black morph form. The yellow form may be female or male, but the black form is always female. The black form may be an example of mimicry and an attempt to look like the less tasty Spicebush Swallowtail. The color can range from very black to a version where the stripes are still noticeable.

How to Attract These Butterflies to Your Landscape:

Add a variety of nectar flowering plants and trees that the adults butterflies enjoy. Caterpillars feast on tree leaves from trees like:

- Tulip Poplar (*Liriodendron tulipifera*)
- Wild Black Cherry (*Prunus serotina*)
- Magnolia (especially *Magnolia virginiana*)

Provide lots of flowering nectar producing plants from spring to fall:

- Bee Balm (*Monarda* spp.)
- Zinnia (*Zinnia* spp.)
- Lantana (*Lantana* spp.)
- Milkweed (*Asclepias* spp.)
- Joe Pye Weed (*Eutrochium purpureum*)
- Purple Coneflower (*Echinacea purpurea*)
