

Town of Morrisville Native Plant Garden



Native plant gardens are a part of the Town of Morrisville's commitment to pollinators by planting a minimum of 70% native plants, including trees, as a part of all Town projects.

Pollinators like honeybees, butterflies, birds, bats, provide vital but often unnoticed benefits. They pollinate crops like apples, bananas, blueberries, strawberries, melon, peaches, potatoes, vanilla, almonds, coffee, and chocolate.



Pollinators visit flowers in their search for food - nectar and pollen. During a flower visit, the pollinators unknowingly deposit pollen from flower to flower. The plant uses the pollen to produce a fruit or seed. Many plants cannot reproduce without pollen carried to them by foraging pollinators.

Three-fourths of the world's flowering plants and about 35% of the world's food depend on animal pollinators to reproduce.
