

PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS,** the monarch butterfly is an iconic North American species whose multigenerational migration and metamorphosis from caterpillar to butterfly has captured the imagination of millions of Americans; and
- WHEREAS,** Both the western and eastern monarch populations have seen significant declines with less than one percent of the western monarch population remaining, while the eastern population has fallen by as much as ninety percent; and
- WHEREAS,** The City of Salem, Virginia, recognizes that human health ultimately depends on well-functioning ecosystems and that biodiverse regions can better support food production, healthy soil and air quality and can foster healthy connections between humans and wildlife; and
- WHEREAS,** Cities, towns and counties have a critical role to play to help save the monarch butterfly, and the City of Salem, Virginia, is striving to become a leader; and
- WHEREAS,** On March 3, 2023, I Renée Ferris Turk, signed the National Wildlife Federation's Mayors' Monarch Pledge and have officially committed to taking meaningful action to protect the monarch butterfly; and
- WHEREAS,** Every resident of The City of Salem can make a difference for the monarch by planting native milkweed and nectar plants to provide habitat for the monarch and pollinators in locations where people live, work, learn, play and worship; and
- WHEREAS,** The City of Salem, Virginia, is actively working to maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at a prominent community location, has planted over one-hundred native species of trees throughout the City this winter and plans to plant numerous more trees/shrubs this season including fruit trees and other natives, and will plant annuals this May offering additional resources for pollinators; and
- WHEREAS,** City Horticulturist, Jeff Ceaser, continues the participation of the Salem Municipal Golf Course in "Monarchs in the Rough," a cooperation program between the USGA, the Audubon Society, & the Environmental Defense Fund to establish or re-establish milkweed species at participating courses. In addition to this, he is currently overseeding into naturalized areas at the municipal golf course and working on establishing some new native prairie plantings at other prominent locations in the City; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I RENÉE FERRIS TURK, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SALEM, COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA, and on behalf of Salem City Council and all our citizens do hereby proclaim March 03, 2023 as:

in The City of Salem, Virginia, and encourage all residents to participate in community activities that support and celebrate monarch conservation.
