Pledge Summary

The Village of Lincolnshire is located in southeast Lake County, approximately 34 miles from downtown Chicago. The Village encompasses 4.58 square miles and has a population of approximately 7,900 residents. The Village is committed to monarch and pollinator education and conservation.

Action Items Committed for 2022

Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Engage with community garden groups and urge them to plant native milkweeds and nectar-producing plants.

Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Host or support a native seed or plant sale, giveaway or swap.

We widely shared information related to our pledge activities in a print newsletter that was mailed to all 7,900 residents, multiple e-news articles with ~1,350 subscribers, a website article, and multiple social media posts with a reach of several thousand between all posts. It's unclear what the demographics breakdown is from all of these sources. We estimate messaging reached adults more than youth, so our unscientific breakdown is 500 youth and 4,500 adult.

The Village of Lincolnshire engaged with the Lincolnshire Garden Club to convert over 500 sq ft of undesirable foliage and failing trees at our local Spring Lake Park "Blue Star Memorial" to a pollinator habitat. Attached are photos of the transformation, draft plans, and final list of flowers that were planted. The plantings were done on Wednesday, July 27, 2022. The soil was amended with high quality compost prior to planting and the site was mulched and edged after planting. The Village's Public Works Department will continuously water the area through the summer and fall until the site becomes established. The Garden Club designed this concept and planted these flowers and will help maintain the site into the future. On August 4, 2022, the Village, on behalf of both the Village and Lincolnshire Garden Club, submitted an application for this area to be included on the Monarch Waystation Registry.
