## Pledge Summary

North Mankato Minnesota is a community with a population of over 14,000. We currently have prairies at Benson Park, Bluff Park and a small demonstration prairie at City Hall along with 19 other community parks, which incorporate Pollinator gardens. In 2022 an area in Spring Lake Park was transitioned into a sanctuary garden. A 5-year plan is in place to make another pollinator garden. Mayor Carlson of North Mankato has committed to saving the Monarch butterfly and other pollinators with the signing of the Mayors' Monarch pledge. It is our goal to work with Local Master Gardeners and the 4H groups to help in the education to our citizens about pollinator gardens and their purpose. We will also give our citizens the option of a "No Mow May" in their yard for the second year in a row.

## Action Items Committed for 2023

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Engage with community garden groups and urge them to plant native milkweeds and nectar-producing plants.
- Engage with city parks and recreation, public works, sustainability, and other relevant staff to identify opportunities to revise and maintain mowing programs and milkweed / native nectar plant planting programs.
- Engage with gardening leaders and partners (e.g., Master Naturalists, Master Gardeners, Nature Centers, Native Plant Society Chapters , other long-standing and influential community leaders) to support monarch butterfly conservation.

### Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Plant or maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at City Hall or another prominent or culturally significant community location.
- Display educational signage at monarch gardens and pollinator habitat.
- Host or support a native seed or plant sale, giveaway or swap.

In 2015 the City of North Mankato established an advisory committee to promote the conservation and maintenance of the city's greenways. This included ditches, outlots, holding ponds, wetlands and prairies. With the tools provided by this Greenspace Committee and the DNR, the committee presented the City Administrator with a directive on February 2, 2016 as an enforcement Policy for city staff and citizens to use for responsible management of greenway areas and code enforcement.

The city works with the DNR specifically in our prairies. The DNR shares concerns and suggestions of proper maintenance that includes mowing, burning and haying in the areas.

Over the last 3 years the City of North Mankato has hosted a "Let's Pollinate" event. In 2021 we planted a demonstration prairie at our City Hall (1001 Belgrade Avenue). In 2022 we planted a prairie at Benson Park (2000 Carlson Drive) and in 2023 we started a pollinator garden at Spring Lake Park (641 Webster Avenue) which we will continue to approve over the next 5 years.
