## Pledge Summary

The City of La Crosse is a city far west on the Mississippi River in the Driftless Region surrounded by bluffs and hills. The population is roughly 50,000 and is home to over 40 parks. Mayor Reynolds of La Crosse, WI has committed to joining the effort by creating healthy habitats for these magnificent butterflies by signing the Mayors' Monarchs pledge and looks forward to further educating the community.

## Action Items Committed for 2022

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Engage with city parks and recreation, public works, sustainability, and other relevant staff to identify opportunities to revise and maintain mowing programs and milkweed / native nectar plant planting programs.
- Engage with gardening leaders and partners (e.g., Master Naturalists, Master Gardeners, Nature Centers, Native Plant Society Chapters , other long-standing and influential community leaders) to support monarch butterfly conservation.

### Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Plant or maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at City Hall or another prominent or culturally significant community location.
- Launch, expand, or continue an invasive species removal program that will support the re-establishment of native habitat for monarch butterflies and other pollinators.
- Display educational signage at monarch gardens and pollinator habitat.

- Change weed or mowing ordinances to allow for native prairie and plant habitats.

In 2022 the Parks Department launched a new program called Beautify La Crosse. This is a program that allows citizens to improve their boulevard, a median, or traffic circle within their neighborhood. The department put together several guidance documents as well as a free and simple application process for applicants. To date 7 residents have completed the program and transformed their boulevard areas with native plant species.

The program has been successful to date however we hope to continue to improve the program to encourage more citizens to take part.

The Department has partnered with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service to restore a historic prairie location on one of the City's conservation properties. The project will include invasive brush removal, cull tree removal followed by annual maintenance and prescribed fire in 2023. The initial invasive brush clearing will begin in 2022.
