La Crosse is home to a 1,000-acre marsh and Grandad Park which is located in the vast and beautiful bluff lands of the area. Any and all pollinators are extremely important to La Crosse due to its large outdoor recreation opportunities. Mayor Reynolds of La Crosse, WI has committed to saving the Monarch butterfly and other pollinators with his signing of the Mayor's Monarch Pledge and looks forward to engaging residents in building more pollinator habitats throughout the city.
