Action Items Committed for 2021

Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Engage with community garden groups and urge them to plant native milkweeds and nectar-producing plants.

Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Initiate or support community science (or citizen science) efforts that help monitor monarch migration and health.
- Launch, expand, or continue an invasive species removal program that will support the re-establishment of native habitat for monarch butterflies and other pollinators.

Systems Change

- Increase the percentage of native plants, shrubs and trees that must be used in city landscaping ordinances and encourage use of milkweed, where appropriate.
- Launch, expand, or continue an effort to change municipal planting ordinances and practices to include more native milkweed and native nectar producing plants at city properties.

The City of Oceanside recently adopted an Integrated Pest Management Plan to place an even higher priority on the use of products and approaches that have the least potential for negative effects on human health, butterflies and other pollinators, and the environment. Part of this plan includes the use of native milkweed and other native plants whenever possible to enhance approximately 254 acres of park facilities, athletic fields, and landscapes at various civic facilities which includes 30 community parks.
