Pledge Summary

Manassas is an urban habitat of 45,000 people located 30 miles southwest of Washington, DC. The city is 10 square miles and has 230 acres of parkland and open space. In 2020 the City adopted a goal that Manassas would be a sustainable and resilient city that values the environment, encourages access to nature, and provides a safe, pleasant, and healthy community for residents of all ages, abilities and incomes. A strategy to achieving that goal includes, "Supporting the conservation of local and regional biodiversity by promoting the protection and enhancement of native plant communities and pollinator and wildlife habitats while managing invasive plant and animal species."

Action Items Committed for 2021

Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Engage with city parks and recreation, public works, sustainability, and other relevant staff to identify opportunities to revise and maintain mowing programs and milkweed / native nectar plant planting programs.

Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Earn or maintain recognition for being a wildlife-friendly city by participating in other wildlife and habitat conservation efforts (i.e., National Wildlife Federation's Community Wildlife Habitat program).
- Add or maintain native milkweed and nectar-producing plants in gardens in the community.

Systems Change

- Launch, expand, or continue an effort to change municipal planting ordinances and practices to include more native milkweed and native nectar producing plants at city properties.

Our annual Tree City and Bee City celebrations have attracted many of our citizens. Our use of social media and written news letters to our citizens play a big role. Our existing plantings of pollinator friendly plants also call attention to our cause. Garden clubs, committees and volunteers assist us in our endeavors also. We will expand our call by use of media to reach out to more people to use more pollinator and butterfly friendly plants.

What else should we know about your monarch butterfly conservation efforts over the last year?

This is our first year to join the Monarch Pledge. Through the years this community, the City Government and its employees, committees and affiliates have strived to make this city an ecologically friendly area. We have an extensive budget to provide and take care of trees, shrubs and flowering plants to provide ample attractions for pollinators and butterflies. Our strict adherence to an IPM program assures the use of very few pesticides. As we continue forward we will be planting much more plants such as milkweed and other natives to attract more Monarch Butterflies.
