The Monarch pledge is part of an ongoing initiative in our community to support Monarch habitat through prairie and pollinator plantings.

The City's ReLeaf initiative has planted 3,861 trees to date. These planting are native trees. The parks department includes proposed pollinator prairie areas in development areas. The department has a naturalized initiated in various parkland throughout the City.

In addition to planting new habitat, we continue to maintain our current habitat through prairie burns.
