## Pledge Summary

Matthews is a suburb of Charlotte NC with a population of 34,000. The town has two community gardens and many parks and open green spaces. Mayor Higdon, an avid gardener and beekeeper, is committed to continuing to make Matthews a welcome and healthy place for monarchs and other pollinators to thrive. Mayor Higdon has signed the Mayor's Monarch Pledge and will encourage Matthews residents to grow and expand sustainable monarch friendly habitat.

## Action Items Committed for 2021

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Engage with community garden groups and urge them to plant native milkweeds and nectar-producing plants.

### Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Add or maintain native milkweed and nectar-producing plants in gardens in the community.

The Appearance/Tree Advisory Committee has three Tree Masters, three Habitat Stewards, and two individuals with a Certificate in Native Plant studies. This has been very useful, as have the resources available to Habitat Stewards from NWF. If there is anything we can use to expand equitable engagement, please let us know! We can use it for training groups, disseminating information and setting up educational displays.

**What else should we know about your monarch butterfly conservation efforts over the last year?**

The Milkweed for Monarchs project came about as the result of a town resident contacting the mayor and asking what we could do for monarchs.
