## Pledge Summary

We were the first Bee city in the state of Georgia and have created 3 pollinator gardens in our small 4 square mile city. We also participated in No Mow Month this March to help our pollinators.

## Action Items Committed for 2023

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods.
