Cape May Point is a Borough located at the tip of the Cape May Peninsula in Cape May County, New Jersey. It is the southernmost point of NJ and on the East Coast monarch migratory path. Mayor Robert Moffatt of Cape May Point is committed to engaging residents in building more pollinator habitat in Cape May Point.

Action Items Committed for 2022

Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. (If you have community members who speak a language other than English, we encourage you to also communicate in that language; Champion Pledges must communicate in that language.)
- Create a community art project to enhance and promote monarch and pollinator conservation as well as cultural awareness and recognition.

Program and Demonstration Gardens

Over the course of several months, numerous members of the community (led by members of the Environmental Commission) worked to remove invasive vines/weeds from a large, unused, overgrown garden bed in a community park. After extensive work to remove invasive, plantings were added with the goal of increasing nectar-producing plants that would flower in the spring, summer and fall.
