The city is on the edge of the Texas Hill Country, is home to over 1000 acres of parkland and preserve areas and maintains two community gardens. The Mayor and Councilmembers of Cedar Park are committed to saving the Monarch population by signing the Mayors Monarch Pledge and engaging the residents in providing pollinator habitat throughout the city.
