McKinney is a unique city nestled along the northeastern region of Texas with a population of approximately 211,397 residents and growing. McKinney's inherent uniqueness hails from its breathtaking trails to its beautiful parks and serene natural settings that create a unique sense of community. Mayor Fuller is committed to preserving the life cycle and migration of the Monarch butterfly by educating residents on how to create and maintain healthy habitats with the signing of the Mayor's Monarch Pledge.

Action Items Committed for 2024

Communications and Convening

Habitat creation for monarchs and other pollinators spans a variety of sites across McKinney. Notably, the McKinney Performing Arts Center is a central location, with additional habitats planned in community gardens, schools, parks, rights-of-way, and other shared public spaces. These diverse locations allow us to reach a broad audience and integrate conservation into daily life across the city.

How are you leveraging the Mayors' Monarch Pledge program to engage marginalized communities, such as low-income communities or communities of color?

The upcoming East McKinney Learning Garden, set to open in December 2024, will feature a dedicated monarch waystation to emphasize the importance of pollinator protection. Located in a food desert, this garden focuses on permaculture and sustainable food practices, providing education and resources in East McKinney. Our commitment to the Mayors' Monarch Pledge will help us seamlessly incorporate monarch education into the garden, fostering greater awareness in underrepresented communities.

What was your community's motivation for taking and continuing to work on the Mayors' Monarch Pledge?

McKinney has a strong commitment to protecting our natural environment, and the Monarch Pledge aligns perfectly with this mission. By championing native plants, we not only support pollinators but also contribute to water conservation and erosion prevention. Monarch symbolism is prominent in our Historic Downtown District, serving as a visible reminder of the city's dedication to conservation and the beauty of our natural heritage.

What resources have been most helpful to you thus far and what new resources would you like to see to help meet your goals? What resources would be useful to help expand equitable engagement in community processes and access to high-quality, usable nature?

Our greatest resource is our community—local educators, volunteers, and organizations are essential partners in supporting monarch and pollinator education. While maintaining a broad environmental focus, having dedicated individuals to champion monarch-specific initiatives has been invaluable. To enhance our efforts, resources that quantify the economic benefits of sustainable practices, like no-mow areas, would provide compelling support for these initiatives. Additionally, fostering greater public demand and interest would accelerate progress toward our conservation goals, further embedding environmental stewardship in the community.

What else should we know about your monarch butterfly conservation efforts over the last year?

Our monarch butterfly conservation efforts this past year have been deeply integrated with broader initiatives, including water conservation and stormwater pollution prevention. We emphasize that protecting pollinators like the monarch supports the health of all beneficial insects and mitigates the impacts of pesticides and fertilizers on our environment. The monarch serves as an accessible and popular symbol for these efforts, helping us connect with the public effectively. By addressing multiple related topics—such as pollinator lifecycles, sustainable gardening, and ecosystem health—we've been able to meet internal goals while also engaging and educating McKinney's citizens. Our community remains highly committed to these initiatives, fostering a positive impact across the board.

The McKinney Office of Environmental Sustainability is collaborating with the McKinney GIS Mapping Team, Asset Management (Public Works), Parks and Recreation Department, McKinney Parks Foundation, and Blackland Prairie Texas Master Naturalists to develop an interactive map showcasing McKinney's greenspaces and grow zones. The Texas Master Naturalists and McKinney Parks Foundation also host public workdays in these grow zones, supporting the maintenance of native habitats for wildlife and pollinators. Our next steps include finalizing the map and partnering with Code Enforcement to establish a home recognition program, highlighting residences that maintain wildlife habitats and pollinator-friendly gardens.

As the coordinator for McKinney Green Gardens, I led key projects to promote native plant conservation this year. We established the Four Corner Monarch Waystations, now recognized as vital pollinator habitats, and organized a 'Plant Rescue,' relocating native plants from a construction site to McKinney Green Gardens. Additionally, a dedicated

volunteer from the local Master Naturalists' Grow-Out Team and generous donations from a local Home Depot contributed significantly to these efforts, further supporting our mission to enhance McKinney's green spaces.
