Marengo is a city located in northern Illinois with a population of approximately 7,500. The city is situated amongst farm and prairie land near the headwaters of the Kishwaukee River. Mayor John Koziol has committed to saving the monarch butterfly and other pollinators with the signing of the Mayor's Monarch Pledge.

Action Items Committed for 2022

Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods.
