## Pledge Summary

Marengo is a community of 7,200 residents on the western side of McHenry County, one of the collar counties of Chicago. Many residents are interested in vegetable and flower gardening, but there is also a lot of turf managed by the city/ park/ schools/ churches/ HOA's that could be converted to pollinator gardens. There is a facebook page called Marengo-Union Mayors Monarch Pledge that has 159 followers, and where the site stewards have been gleaned from. 2021 was the first year for Marengo in this program, and 8 sites were started successfully

This year we also added a parkway downtown in Marengo that was weed-choked and ugly. The city donated soil and we planted 100's of natives

At the McHenry County Fair we had 6 tables of monarchs, displays, free common milkweed seeds. We planted 1,600 native seeds in spring, then placed them in 2 greenhouses to get an early start, then distributed them among all our pollinator gardens

We maintain a facebook page with 193 members to exchange info and ask for helpers. We set up 6 tables at McHenry County Fair, attended by 20.000 people. Tables included monarch caterpillars, pupae and butterflies, info on how to plant native pollinators. A Big success! We also posted a MMP sign that was handpainted at each MMP garden. We had the signs made by a local sign shop with appropriate wording, then had a volunteer hand paint them with beautiful pollinators and natives plants. They are so stunning, we mounted them with tamper proof bolts, and so far none of them have been stolen. A win!
