## Pledge Summary

Raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. (Post to Website and FB) Engage with Riley Township, and other relevant staff to identify opportunities to revise and maintain mowing programs and milkweed / native nectar plant planting programs. (Train mowers/employees when/how to mow) Engage with Homeowners Associations (HOAs), Community Associations or neighborhood organizations to identify opportunities to plant monarch gardens and revise maintenance and mowing programs. Plant or maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at Riley Town Hall or Riley School. Convert vacant lots to monarch habitat. Display educational signage at monarch gardens and pollinator habitat (Funding could come from grants or donated \$\$ within the community).

## Action Items Committed for 2024

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods.
