**How are you leveraging the Mayors' Monarch Pledge program to engage marginalized communities, such as low-income communities or communities of color?**

The Village of Port Chester is a majority low-income community with a very high Hispanic population (60-65%) so all Mayors Monarch pledge activities involve engaging with low-income communities.

**What was your community's motivation for taking and continuing to work on the Mayors' Monarch Pledge?**

The pledge was brought to the Mayor's attention by the Port Chester Sustainability Committee. The intention was to raise awareness of pollinator population declines, and start creating pollinator-friendly habitat where possible in the Village. We plan to take the pledge next year, adding more pollinator habitat in different locations.

**What resources have been most helpful to you thus far and what new resources would you like to see to help meet your goals? What resources would be useful to help expand equitable engagement in community processes and access to high-quality, usable nature?**

Examples of language for educational signage would be helpful. It would also be helpful to have a separate Mayor Monarch pledge page available in Spanish, so we could link to it, instead of having to translate everything. The Village of Port Chester is a small geographical area and is densely populated, so space for pollinator-friendly habitat is not always easily available. We chose "Planting or maintaining a pollinator-friendly demonstration garden" because we knew, particularly in our 1st year, that we would not be able to plant a large area, so we were surprised to be asked how many "Acres" we had planted. We're sure other communities are in similar positions, so it would be less intimidating to add "square feet" to the question.

**What else should we know about your monarch butterfly conservation efforts over the last year?**

In addition to completing the 3 items we selected from the Mayors' Monarchs Pledge list, we also completed the following: We established Green Awards which were given to 6 local

homeowners or businesses for their planting of native plants in their home or business. Large display boards were created about pollinators and native plants, for use at all our events. We attended the following events, held by other organizations, to raise awareness of our work - Decarbonization Day, May 13, organized by Rye Sustainability Committee, in Rye, New York. - Port Chester Day, Aug 26, organized by Village of Port Chester. - Department of Public Works Day, May 27, organized by Village of Port Chester. - Will also attend Village of Port Chester's Christmas Parade & Historical Society Winterfest, Dec 9.

We held a Seed Swap & Giveaway in the Spring (April 29) and in the Fall (Oct 28). We attended an "In Bloom" event at the Port Chester Middle School on May 31 where we also gave away plants and seeds. The totals from all 3 events are as follows: Plants: 100 Seeds: tens of thousands (milkweed, anise hyssop, goldenrod, boneset, blazing star, combine, asters, sea-oats, turtlehead) We will also be leaving native seed packets in the Port Chester Rye Brook Public Library for anyone to take and plant.
