Pledge Summary

The City of Dana Point is a beachside community in southern California that is home to over 30,000 residents. Dana Point is named after author/adventurer Richard Henry Dana Jr. who described the area as the "only romantic spot on the coast" in his book *Two Years Before the Mast*. Dana Point has long been a stop over for the western Monarch Butterfly during their migration, so much so that one of our coastal communities is called Monarch Beach. The City has committed to creating Monarch habitat throughout the community to ensure that Monarch butterflies continue to have a place to rest, relax or call home in Dana Point.

Action Items Committed for 2022

Communications and Convening

- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. (If you have community members who speak a language other than English, we encourage you to also communicate in that language; Champion Pledges must communicate in that language.)
- Engage with city parks and recreation, public works, sustainability, and other relevant staff to identify opportunities to revise and maintain mowing programs and milkweed / native nectar plant planting programs.
- Engage with Homeowners Associations (HOAs), Community Associations or neighborhood organizations to identify opportunities to plant monarch gardens and revise maintenance and mowing programs.

- Plant or maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at City Hall or another prominent or culturally significant community location.
- Convert vacant lots to monarch habitat.
- Add or maintain native milkweed and nectar-producing plants in gardens in the community.
- Display educational signage at monarch gardens and pollinator habitat.

Systems Change

- Increase the percentage of native plants, shrubs and trees that must be used in city landscaping ordinances and encourage use of milkweed, where appropriate.

The City of Dana Points owns and operates 28 parks. The habitats are being constructed in the parks with a acreage goal of each park habitat being 10,000 sq ft built over a period of 10 years. The parks are significantly popular in the community among residents and touring visitors. Residents have also been inspired to create habitats in their backyards throughout the city.

How are you leveraging the Mayors' Monarch Pledge program to engage marginalized communities, such as low-income communities or communities of color?

The City of Dana Point welcomes all volunteers and employs nondiscrimination practices. Based on 115 volunteer residencies, the project has reached communities as far as Los Angeles. Other marginalized communities include people with disabilities. Accommodated workdays have been, and will be, scheduled upon request for K-12 schools (public and private) as well as any other groups that need private work days to participate. Tools and work done on those days have also been accommodated to ensure equal access.

What was your community's motivation for taking and continuing to work on the Mayors' Monarch Pledge?

Monarch Beach in City of Dana Point has seen few butterflies since the population declined. Once named after the butterfly, the community has been inspired to see the butterfly return. City of Dana Point residents are passionate about being engaged in projects that better their community and bring back the natural habitat that Monarch's and pollinators are in need of.

What resources have been most helpful to you thus far and what new resources would you like to see to help meet your goals? What resources would be useful to help expand equitable engagement in community processes and access to high-quality, usable nature?

By creating a Monarch Habitat Plan, goals have been outlined and achieved. Volunteers have been monumental to the project and community engagement. The reach has been widespread and especially impactful for the marginalized communities we worked with this past year. Future needs include increasing public awareness (social media, newspapers, etc.) and project grant funding to increase the annual workload.

What else should we know about your monarch butterfly conservation efforts over the last year?

In 2022, 115 volunteers participated in the habitat building days. Over the course of the dates, volunteer numbers increased and 2023 is expected to yield the same success.

This is an ongoing project. Each year all habitats will be increased to acreage goals. For 2023, each existing habitat site will be increased to 1000 sq ft (1/4 acre). An additional site will be added yearly and created in size to the acre goal. In 2023, a 1000 sq ft habitat will be installed in a new location at Sea Canyon Park.
