7 mini meadows with pollinator friendly native seeds were installed at 7 fire stations throughout the city. There was an agreement that the fire department would tend to each "meadow", not spray any pesticides or mow over the area as it is a protected wildlife area as well. At the of the season, late November it would be mowed over to re-seed for the next year.

Gastonia Fire Department, Gaston County Community Foundation, 4 different high schools...57 different volunteers helped to create the meadows.
