Last year we planted numerous pollinator plants and plan to continue to do so in 2022. We have seen an increase in the monarch population within our city and look forward to continuous growth. We are proud to be part of the Mayor's Pledge and encourage others to join.

Action Items Committed for 2022

Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Engage with community garden groups and urge them to plant native milkweeds and nectar-producing plants.
- Engage with city parks and recreation, public works, sustainability, and other relevant staff to identify opportunities to revise and maintain mowing programs and milkweed / native nectar plant planting programs.
- Engage with gardening leaders and partners (e.g., Master Naturalists, Master Gardeners, Nature Centers, Native Plant Society Chapters, other long-standing and influential community leaders) to support monarch butterfly conservation.
- Engage with Homeowners Associations (HOAs), Community Associations or neighborhood organizations to identify opportunities to plant monarch gardens and revise maintenance and mowing programs.

Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Plant or maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at City Hall or another prominent or culturally significant community location.
- Plant milkweed and pollinator-friendly native nectar plants along roadsides, medians, or public rights-of-way.
- Add or maintain native milkweed and nectar-producing plants in gardens in the community.
- Display educational signage at monarch gardens and pollinator habitat.

Systems Change

- Change weed or mowing ordinances to allow for native prairie and plant habitats.

- Increase the percentage of native plants, shrubs and trees that must be used in city landscaping ordinances and encourage use of milkweed, where appropriate.

>NW Arkansas Master Naturalist planted pollinator plants and maintained pollinator planting beds at the City of Bella Vista's Buckingham trailhead. >NW Arkansas Master Naturalist planted swamp milkweed and prepared pollinator beds with Cooper Elementary school for kids. >NW Arkansas Master Naturalist helped plant and maintain pollinator beds at the Mercy Clinic Community Garden. >NW Arkansas Master Naturalist maintain a greenhouse and each year grow plants from seed to plants that are ready to be planted in the ground. >NW Arkansas Master Naturalist maintain a natural area for pollinators and pollinator beds at Blowing Springs (removal of invasive plants, weeds, etc.).

>City of Bella Vista gave out 400 native trees and shrubs that serve as host plants and nectar sources for pollinators at their spring and fall tree giveaways. >City of Bella Vista Tree Advisory Board gave out 100 packets of Swamp Milkweed seed at the fall tree giveaway to local residents. >Tree Advisory Board discussed and identified pollinator educational projects and locations for pollinator plantings. >Tree Advisory Board urged city staff to incorporate pollinator plantings including milkweed in their maintenance program of trails. >Tree Advisory Board urged city staff to revise city landscape requirements to incorporate a majority of native plants and highly suggest milkweed in every landscape.

The City of Bella Vista has partnered with local chapter of Master Naturalist to plant and maintain pollinator beds. The Master Naturalist work with the local school and hospital to establish pollinator beds and community gardens. The City of Bella Vista's Tree Advisory Board has televised discussions about the importance of native trees, shrubs and other pollinator plants to the survival of the Monarch Butterfly and other pollinators and how pollinators play an important role in ecosystem services. The Tree Advisory Board members gave away 100 packets of milkweed seed. City of Bella Vista gave away 400 native trees and flowering shrubs at the spring and fall tree giveaway events.
