The Village participates in the National Wildlife Federation's "Mayor's Monarch Pledge" program to take actions to help save the Monarch butterfly and the Mayor Steve Lentz has proclaimed June 3 as "Mayor's Monarch Pledge Day" in Mundelein! The half day event will feature several children's activities, an expert presentation on native landscaping, great food and music, information booths, and plant and seed giveaways. "We're hoping this event will help to inform the community about the important work we're doing on the Beautification Committee and provide information on simple sustainability practices we can all implement to make a significant positive impact in our community and our world," explains Jenny Berman Ross, Mundelein Trustee. "We are very excited to welcome our keynote speaker, Kelsay Shaw who is the founder and owner of Possibility Place-a native plant nursery. Kelsay will explain the role of the monarch butterfly and other pollinators in our world. He is an excellent speaker with a vitally important message that we all need to hear," she adds. Please describe when the lots were converted to monarch habitat and the planned maintenance schedule.

The Village of Mundelein's pollinator project is multi-faceted, multi-staged project. The first stage was the installation of the storm water retention pond completed in 2022. This project solved a decades long flooding problem in Mundelein. The retention pond has evolved into a natural habitat for all kinds of birds, butterflies, and wildlife. The walking trail around the pond provides community access to view nature in the purest sense. The Courtland Commons Pollinator Garden, planted in 2023, is the second part of the project. Community groups assisted with planting all types of pollinator plants so that a small section of the overall project would be dedicated specifically to saving the monarch butterfly. The final stage of this project is now underway with a Summer 2024 completion date. This part of the project is a public gathering space-Courtland Commons. Mundelein plans to use this space for festivals, concerts, plays and other events. The area is intended to build community and foster an appreciation for nature and the outdoors.
