Town of Flower Mound Environmental Services hosted Monarch Watch Conservation Specialist Carol Clark for a library presentation on creating Monarch Waystations and an educational "Introduction to Monarch Conservation" video, which was posted across Town media channels. Environmental Services worked with local Monarch advocate Tom Kirwan (PepsiCo), the Texas Master Naturalists Elm Fork Chapter, Town Library staff, and Town Communications department staff to produce and promote the video and speaker presentation.

The primary Monarch Waystation is located on the grounds of Town Hall in Flower Mound (2121 Cross Timbers Flower Mound, TX), directly on the Migratory Route for Eastern Migratory Monarchs (just northwest of DFW).

Environmental Services worked with Keep Denton Beautiful to rehome native liatris, and with internal staff to maintain the garden.
