Known as the Christmas Capital of Texas, Grapevine has renowned festivals and events. Residents and visitors enjoy over 1,600 acres of parkland, 23 trails, and more than 9 miles of shoreline along Grapevine Lake. Mayor William D. Tate is committed to reversing the decline of the monarch butterfly and other pollinators with the signing of the Mayor's Monarch Pledge and continues to engage with the people of Grapevine in providing more habitat for these magnificent creatures.
