### Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Host or support a native seed or plant sale, giveaway or swap.
- Plant or maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at City Hall or another prominent or culturally significant community location.

Habitat creation is happening in local parks, as part of stormwater pond improvement projects, and on private property through the City's Rainwater Rewards grant program. This program provided 50% up to \$500 for installing native plantings, shoreline buffers, and raingardens.

**How are you leveraging the Mayors' Monarch Pledge program to engage marginalized communities, such as low-income communities or communities of color?**

The City partners with the local Soil and Water Conservation District to provide workshops, resources, and project dollars to all Dakota County residents. By providing these programs we are able to incentivize plantings for all members of the community.

**What was your community's motivation for taking and continuing to work on the Mayors' Monarch Pledge?**

Spreading the word on native plantings helps us protect our pollinator habitat while also providing benefits to water quality. This pledge shows our dedication to enhancing these valuable assets in our community.

**What resources have been most helpful to you thus far and what new resources would you like to see to help meet your goals? What resources would be useful to help expand equitable engagement in community processes and access to high-quality, usable nature?**

We are grateful for the local resources we have available and have not utilized resources from this program.

**What else should we know about your monarch butterfly conservation efforts over the last year?**

The City began its first turf to prairie conversion totaling 3 acres. Tintah parks features a large grass area that was underutilized. This new prairie will provide walking paths so people can re-connect with the prairie and pollinators that once covered the region.

The City utilized a Scout to complete the planting of 504 native plants at the Apple Valley Community and Senior Center. In addition, we utilized a volunteer group, EcoAdvocates to complete maintenance on a basin at the Community Center.
