Pledge Summary

The Village of Hawthorn Woods, Illinois, located just 35 miles north of the City of Chicago with approximately 8,350 residents, is an upscale, friendly “rural by design” community. As a certified Bee City USA affiliate and an International Dark Sky Community, the Village is fiercely committed to protecting our natural resources, boasting twenty-three park sites and two pollinator habitats – Brierwoods Preserve and our newly dedicated Meadowlark Park and Arboretum. Mayor Dominick DiMaggio of the Village of Hawthorn Woods, Illinois, has committed to saving the Monarch butterfly and other pollinators with the signing of the Mayors’ Monarch Pledge and looks forward to expanding pollinator environments throughout the community.

Action Items Committed for 2021

Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Convert vacant lots to monarch habitat.
- Host or support a native seed or plant sale, giveaway or swap.
- Launch, expand, or continue an invasive species removal program that will support the re-establishment of native habitat for monarch butterflies and other pollinators.

Systems Change

- Integrate monarch butterfly conservation into the city’s Park Master Plan, Sustainability Plan, Climate Resiliency Plan or other city plans.
- Launch, expand, or continue one or more ordinances to reduce light pollution to benefit urban wildlife.

Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species’ need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. As a proclaimed Monarch Butterfly Way Station, the Village of Hawthorn Woods is dedicated to the survival of the Monarch butterfly.

What resources have been most helpful to you thus far and what new resources would you like to see to help meet your goals? What resources would be useful to help expand equitable engagement in community processes and access to high-quality, usable nature?

The Village of Hawthorn Woods Meadowlark Park and Arboretum consists of a 2.5-acre pollinator meadow, for which grant funding was received by the Canadian National Railway Company, America in Bloom, and the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation. The park dedication ceremony took place in October of 2021. We received assistance with watering, planting, and weeding from the Hawthorn Woods in Bloom Committee and the Rotary Club of Long Grove/Kildeer/Hawthorn Woods. We will continue to pursue potential grant opportunities and to expand our volunteer base in order to maintain, enhance, and expand our pollinator habitats.

The 3.5-acre turf grass lot conversion was completed on October 11, 2021, consisting of a 2.5-acre pollinator meadow, to create our Meadowlark Park and Arboretum. Ongoing park and habitat maintenance is conducted by our Parks Crew and Public Works Crew on a weekly basis. Planting, watering, and weeding efforts are also conducted by numerous, active volunteer groups.

Please describe the extent of revisions or maintenance to invasive species removal programs, as well as the practices or techniques used to remove the invasive plants.

Brierwoods Preserve was once an 11.5-acre thicket of overgrown vegetation. However, through the extensive clearing and planting efforts of our Village Parks Crew and a diverse group of dedicated volunteers, such as Aqua Illinois and Boy Scout Troop #92, Brierwoods Preserve is now a sustainable woodland and wetland pollinator habitat, open to the public and accessible to all mobilities. Our thorough and efficient invasive species removal is conducted by our Parks Crew and Public Works Crew, as well as our many volunteers under the guidance of our certified pesticide operators. The removal is manual, both in tools and labor.
