## Pledge Summary

The Village of Hawthorn Woods, Illinois, located just 35 miles north of the City of Chicago with approximately 9,062 residents, is an upscale, friendly “rural by design” community. As a certified Bee City USA and Tree City USA affiliate, an Audubon International Sustainable Community, and an International Dark Sky Community, the Village is fiercely committed to protecting our natural resources, boasting twenty-four park sites and four pollinator habitats – Brierwoods Preserve, Meadowlark Park and Arboretum, Indian Creek Preserve, and the Hawthorn Heritage Outdoor Museum Trail. Mayor Dominick DiMaggio of the Village of Hawthorn Woods, Illinois, has committed to saving the Monarch butterfly and other pollinators with the signing of the Mayors’ Monarch Pledge and looks forward to expanding pollinator environments throughout the community.

## Action Items Committed for 2023

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species’ need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.

### Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Host or support a native seed or plant sale, giveaway or swap.
- Launch, expand, or continue an invasive species removal program that will support the re-establishment of native habitat for monarch butterflies and other pollinators.

Pollinator habitat was created within our new Indian Creek Preserve, totaling 1/2-acre. The dedication ceremony took place on August 9, 2023. Our new Leo and Naomi Burnett Memorial Garden, as part of our Hawthorn Heritage Outdoor Museum Trail located within Community Park, is a 1/4-acre pollinator habitat. The dedication ceremony will take place on April 13, 2024. Pollinator habitat was also implemented within our Heritage Oaks Park at each of the two park entrances and three linear municipal islands, totaling 1/2-acre.

**How are you leveraging the Mayors' Monarch Pledge program to engage marginalized communities, such as low-income communities or communities of color?**

The Village of Hawthorn Woods Brierwoods Preserve, Meadowlark Park and Arboretum, Indian Creek Preserve, Community Park, and Heritage Oaks are five public parks consisting of pollinator habitats, open year-round from sunrise to sunset, accessible to all mobilities.

**What was your community's motivation for taking and continuing to work on the Mayors' Monarch Pledge?**

As a proclaimed waystation for the Monarch Butterfly, the Village of Hawthorn Woods remains steadfast in our commitment to sustainable environmental stewardship.

**What resources have been most helpful to you thus far and what new resources would you like to see to help meet your goals? What resources would be useful to help expand equitable engagement in community processes and access to high-quality, usable nature?**

The Village of Hawthorn Woods is proud to partner with the Illinois Monarch Project to educate, inform, and advocate for the further establishment of pollinator habitats in residential communities. As a new resource, the Village would welcome funding opportunities through the Illinois Department of Natural Resources and the Illinois Department of Agriculture. A useful resource would be a central database of all non-profit organizations involved in Monarch preservation activities throughout the Chicagoland area.

**What else should we know about your monarch butterfly conservation efforts over the last year?**

Whenever a dedication ceremony for a park, preserve, or memorial garden takes place, the Village provides pollinator seed packets for all attendees to disperse throughout the dedication site. .

**What is the total acreage of land treated to remove invasive plants?**

A total of 3 acres of teasel was removed at our Meadowlark Park and Arboretum, along with 2 acres of buckthorn removal at Indian Creek Preserve and 1/2-acre of buckthorn removal at Brierwoods Preserve.

**Please describe the extent of revisions or maintenance to invasive species removal programs, as well as the practices or techniques used to remove the invasive plants.**

All invasive buckthorn and teasel were painstakingly removed by hand, including all root systems. This extensive invasive removal was conducted by our Parks staff and numerous volunteer groups, such as: Friends of Indian Creek Wetlands; Hawthorn Woods in Bloom Committee; Stevenson High School Green Team; Fairmont Elementary School students and parents; and Digital GreenSigns, LLC employees.
