## Pledge Summary

Knightdale is a town in eastern Wake County, North Carolina, with a population of approximately 22,000 residents. Our strategic plan highlights sustainability as a core tenet. Knightdale seeks to promote the stewardship of our environment. Mayor Day and our Town Council have committed to saving the Monarch Butterfly by joining this pledge.

## Action Items Committed for 2024

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. - Engage with community garden groups and urge them to plant native milkweeds and nectar-producing plants.
