**What else should we know about your monarch butterfly conservation efforts over the last year?**

The Greater Arkansas River Nature Association held two very popular butterfly walks along Salida's Monarch Spur Trail. Participants saw many kinds of butterflies due to the previous restoration efforts through youth programs and volunteers.
