Currently the ordinances are being reorganized and we hope to have additions/changes made by the end of 2024. We're working to add more native plants in most newly planted areas as buildings are constructed. This is on-going. Parks and Recreation has been incorporating more native plants as areas are repaired for projects. For example, we added 100 lbs of Little Bluestem seed, 1280 native grasses and 250 native perennials along the dam and shoreline of one of our ponds in March 2023. We also stabilized a stream bank with 450 native trees/shrubs in December 2023.
