The City of Lee's Summit is a southeastern suburban community with a population of roughly 100,000 residents. City staff and the Lee's Summit Beautification Commission are committed to creating an environment that promotes the health and sustainability of monarch butterflies and other pollinators.

## Action Items Committed for 2022

### Communications and Convening

### Program and Demonstration Gardens
