Pledge Summary

Mayor Marie Gallo accepted the Mayors' Monarch Pledge in tandem with her goal to expand the Parks and Recreation Department in the city. The Parks & Recreation Staff come from various outdoor recreation backgrounds including habitat restoration, natural resources, environmental education & safety. Mayor Gallo hopes to engage the community in abundant and diverse programs including educating the public on the importance of the native species we share our city with.

Parma Heights Recreation cleaned and bagged seeds for the Pearl Road School open house where students & families learned about the importance of pollinators and how to start the seed germination process. Launch, expand, or continue an invasive species removal program that will support the re-establishment of native habitat for monarch butterflies and other pollinators.

The City of Parma Heights Recreation Department now has staff trained on the identification and removal of invasive species as well as proper herbicide application by the state of Ohio. This year in Greenbrier Commons an effort was made to control the various species like Forsythia, Berberis vulgaris, Rhamnus cathartica, Pachysandra terminalis & Lonicera japonica. Due to the small size of the park only manual pulling & cutting techniques were used. In order to continue manual maintenance we will be looking for volunteers to be trained on the identification of the plants and help with the restoration of the site.

Pollinator Garden (41.394040, -81.763198) This garden is located right outside of our heavily trafficked community theatre & connector trail to Big Creek Reservation. The community center will be a base for 2023 programming where we will continue education efforts on habitat restoration & promoting community involvement in further expansion of the Mayor's Monarch Pledge. The addition of the pollinator garden in front of the entrance to the connector trail familiarized people with the native plants they are going to see further

within the reservation. Our native plants were donated by Spring Hill Nursery a local homegrown nursery.
