This will be Mayor Gallo's third year taking the Mayors' Monarch Pledge. With six beautiful parks and 20,000 residents, Parma Heights is a prime city for caring for Monarch Butterflies. We will continue to educate others and improve the policies we have implemented to extend our resources toward the pledge's efforts.

Action Items Committed for 2024

Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. - Create a community art project to enhance and promote monarch and pollinator conservation as well as cultural awareness and recognition.

Parma Heights now has 3 places it maintains native pollinator plants. Greenbrier Commons (6281 Pearl Road), Cassidy Community Theatre (6200 Pearl Rd), and Nathan Hale Park (7075 Parma Park Blvd). Nathan Hale Park had 9 of its 25 acres modified to hold a brand new retention basin, that was seeded with native wildflowers (for reference the walking trail is just under .5 miles). All green space inside the trail North of the Red Flag pictured was seeded with native wildflower seed mix including, this year we saw Purple Coneflower, Asters, Golden Rod, and Black Eyed Susan, and plan to see more as the seeds germinate and mature! Now some of our most visited parks have gardens holding at least 7 different species of pollinator plants. Each of these places host community events like summer concerts, community plays, annual Earth Day parties, and daily recreational walking by residents! Greenbrier Commons in particular connects to Big Creek Reservation in Cleveland Metroparks so we are dedicated to ensuring their stewardship is maintained past their property in Parma Heights.
