## Pledge Summary

Brackenridge is a one-square mile town of approximately 3,200 yinzers and neighbors nestled along the Allegheny River just north of Pittsburgh, PA. We have a dedicated group of citizens who work with elected officials to promote conservation and community greening efforts to grow and protect pollinator habitats.

## Action Items Committed for 2024

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. (If you have community members who speak a language other than English, we encourage you to also communicate in that language; Champion Pledges must communicate in that language.)
- Engage with community garden groups and urge them to plant native milkweeds and nectar-producing plants.
