## Pledge Summary

Grosse Pointe Park is a city bordering Detroit (largest city in Michigan,) with a population of 11,555. The city boasts two lovely waterfront parks. The waterway is part of Lake St. Clair. Grosse Pointe Park took the pledge and earned Leadership Circle status in 2016 under Mayor Robert Denner. Michele Hodges, current Mayor of GPP, has wholeheartedly committed to continuing this effort to protect, and spread awareness about the decline of, the Monarch Butterfly.

## Action Items Committed for 2023

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Engage with community garden groups and urge them to plant native milkweeds and nectar-producing plants.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. (If you have community members who speak a language other than English, we encourage you to also communicate in that language; Champion Pledges must communicate in that language.)

### Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Host or support a native seed or plant sale, giveaway or swap.
- Plant or maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at City Hall or another prominent or culturally significant community location.
- Initiate or support community science (or citizen science) efforts that help monitor monarch migration and health.
- Add or maintain native milkweed and nectar-producing plants in gardens in the community.
- Facilitate or support a milkweed seed collection and propagation effort.
- Display educational signage at monarch gardens and pollinator habitat.
- Convert vacant lots to monarch habitat.
- Plant milkweed and pollinator-friendly native nectar plants along roadsides, medians, or public rights-of-way.
- Earn or maintain recognition for being a wildlife-friendly city by participating in other wildlife and habitat conservation efforts (i.e., National Wildlife Federation's Community Wildlife Habitat program).

## Systems Change

- Remove milkweed from the list of noxious plants in city weed / landscaping ordinances (if applicable).
- Launch, expand, or continue an effort to change municipal planting ordinances and practices to include more native milkweed and native nectar producing plants at city properties.

We connected with the Grosse Pointe Garden Center, who works with schools doing gardens and lunchtime enrichment. We discussed the possibility of future partnerships, including creating Monarch Waystations together. We also participated in their Family Garden Fun Day Workshop on April 15th, by hosting the butterfly table. We distributed lots of resources, including information about upcoming native plant sales, waystations and pollinator gardening. We performed an anatomy of a butterfly skit and made pollinator headbands with the kids. We also attended a meeting at the Helm assisted living facility on August 14th, passed out Waystation brochures and encouraged them to include native milkweeds and nectar plants in the design of their new gardens.

Our efforts involved coordinating with residents and members of the Beautification Commission. In the Spring, we rescued 200 A. incarnata seedlings to giveaway at events. In the Fall, we worked together to harvest various species of milkweeds from different sites including Patterson Park, resident gardens and Oudolf Garden Detroit. The seeds will be donated to Monarch Watch, Save the Monarchs and our local Seed Library. Last Winter, we also hosted a milk jug seed sowing workshop at the Library and provided several native seeds including milkweed.

We celebrated Pollinator Month in April with various neighborhood walks and events that promoted citizen science. In July, library patrons were also invited to participate in Journey North's Symbolic Migration program.

**Please describe your effort in completing this action.**

Along with the GPPBC, we helped organize Community Garden Clean-up and planting days for the beds along the boardwalk at Patterson Park. Our goal was to add more native plants to the landscaping, as well as diversify the existing butterfly garden, by thinning the existing Common Milkweed and adding more host plants and nectar sources that will bloom all season, particularly late-blooming ones such as Asters and Goldenrods. Residents, along with a local nursery, donated approximately 30 plants total for the beds. We were also approved to receive 192 plants from NWF Garden for Wildlife's donation program. 16 plants were missing from the shipment, but we held a Volunteer planting day on 9/30/2023 and were still able to get 176 plants in the ground!
