56 Church Street, Mountain Brook, AL 35213. The city's initial demonstration garden is a pollinator garden at city hall. Along with 25 different native plant species the city planted swamp milkweed and butterfly milkweed. We have planted late-blooming aster to support fall migrating monarchs, and we will be planting goldenrod in the coming season. We are in the process of identifying other areas of city property to plant milkweed (along with other native plants).

While the city hall pollinator garden is "complete" it is just one small part of the city hall grounds. We are working on changing all plantings around city hall (and on all city properties) to specifically exclude the use of invasive ornamental species that are known to be a hazard to native habitats. We expect our Environmental Sustainability committee to make a formal recommendation to the city council about the use of invasive plants before the spring change-out of pots and in-ground plants at city hall.
