Please describe the maintenance schedule for these planted areas.

We seeded the area we did not plant, plants. We put out 6lbs of seed. We mow this area 2 times per year. One time in the spring after the flowers have gone to seed to redistribute the seeds and then one time in the fall/winter. At Julia Bergen we put out 12lbs of seed and maintain the same way.
