## Pledge Summary

The Town of Penfield is located in New York State with a population of just under 40,000. On the outskirts of the City of Rochester Penfield has 10 town owned parks including approximately 390 acres of land. Penfield strives to be a good steward of the environment and has a sustainability committee that focuses on energy and environmental conservation. Supervisor Leenhouts and the Penfield Town Board are dedicated to taking initiatives to protect native pollinators, specifically the monarch butterfly, and look forward to continuing to engage with residents through education and protection of pollinator habitat.

## Action Items Committed for 2025

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Engage with city parks and recreation, public works, sustainability, and other relevant staff to identify opportunities to revise and maintain mowing programs and milkweed / native nectar plant planting programs.

### Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Facilitate or support a milkweed seed collection and propagation effort.

The Town's Sustainability Engineer and Public Works Department worked together and with the local Color Your Community Green group (CPG) to improve the Town's Meadow Mowing Program. This included timed mowing to allow milkweed and other pollinator plants to spread their seeds prior to mowing the appropriate portion of Town parks in the fall. The Town also worked with this group to organize maintenance on pollinator gardens.

Swamp Milkweed, *Asclepias incarnata*, Butterfly Weed, *Asclepias tuberosa*, Joe-Pye Weed, *Eutrochium maculatum*, Black-Eyed Susan, *Rudbeckia hirta*, Purple Coneflower, *Echinacea, pupurea*, Foxglove, beardtongue, *Penstemon digitalis*, Aster, *Eurybia*, Side-Oats Grama, *Bouteloua curtipendula*

**Please describe the milkweed seed collection and propagation effort that you hosted.**

Town staff met with two members of Color Penfield Green (CPG) and Two adults and 25 children from the Scribner Road Elementary Environmental Club to spread seeds that were collected by the CPG members on Town Property at Shadow Pines. The area that was seeded is part of the Meadow Mowing Program and was just mowed for this year; it will not be mowed again for another two years to allow pollinator plants to take root and grow.
