Pledge Summary

Malvern is a small borough in southeastern Pennsylvania with a population of roughly 3,000 covering approximately one square mile of Chester County. The Borough is home to many open spaces including Randolph Woods and the site of the Paoli Massacre that occurred during the Revolutionary War. Mayor Uzman of the Borough of Malvern has committed to saving the monarch butterfly and other pollinators with the signing of the mayors' Monarch Pledge and looks forward to engaging residents in building more pollinator habitat throughout the borough.

Action Items Committed for 2025

Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. The plants are watered daily during the dry season. In the fall, after the majority of seeds have been eaten by birds, the plants are cut back.

EAC and an independent group of residents are looking at the amount of light pollution in the Borough. Currently, this group is mapping out location of all Borough owned lighting, decorative street lights, overhead cobra lights, landscape lighting. Based on this mapping, lights that overlap or are redundant will be proposed to be removed. The Borough ordinance already addresses down lighting, removing up lighting. The committee will look at other recommended ways to reduce the light pollution in the Borough and make a report to the entire Council in 2026
