## Pledge Summary

Abuzz For Wildlife in Eatontown is a grassroots organization that seeks to provide opportunities for public engagement for establishing wildlife habitats around the Borough of Eatontown which will become a wildlife corridor for migrating species, includes pollinators such as the Monarch Butterfly.

## Action Items Committed for 2023

### Communications and Convening

- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. ### Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Convert vacant lots to monarch habitat.

- Add or maintain native milkweed and nectar-producing plants in gardens in the community.

10 acres

**Please describe the extent of revisions or maintenance to invasive species removal programs, as well as the practices or techniques used to remove the invasive plants.**

We established a team in September 2021 to start to remove, by hand, invasive vines and plants in our 47 acre F. Bliss Price Arboretum and Wildlife Sanctuary, Wyckoff Road. During that time we have held monthly work parties. We continue to hold work parties during the year to continue removal. We have not used any chemicals. Our mitigation of invasives will allow for natives to grow, including monarch habitat.

Our group has focused on encouraging residents to plant wildlife habitats through Facebook posts, outreach events, a table at our library and information handouts at Boro Hall and the community garden. We have not yet expanded it to include specifically monarch Butterfly gardens. We will do this in 2024.
