## Pledge Summary

The City of Kyle is located in Central Texas, just South of Austin, with a population of over 50,000. Kyle has experienced local growth, resulting in high demand for parks, trails and recreational programs. The City of Kyle Parks and Recreation Department includes a parks division, trails division and an Outdoor Nature Education specialist. Kyle is committed to monarch and pollinator conservation and has recently designated a wildflower garden at the Bunton Park Trail Loop.

In 2022 we implemented a plan for a 17 acre wildflower meadow. Educational signage was posted as well showing information on our local pollinators, including Monarch butterflies. We also adopted a partial mowing program for our Wildflower Loop. In 2023 we planted 3 flats of milkweed plugs from Monarch Watch in the 17 acre Wildflower Loop at Bunton Park.
