Willowbrook is a Village within the Chicagoland area, a southwestern suburb of the City of Chicago, with a population just over 9,000. The Village is located within DuPage County and is home to many parks and public greenspace, many of our Village parks are undergoing redevelopment which will see the installation of several features that will help increase the monarch butterfly population. Mayor Trilla has committed to helping save monarch butterflies and other pollinators with his signing of the Mayors' Monarch Pledge and looks forward to engaging residents in building more pollinator habitat throughout the Village.

Action Items Committed for 2025

Communications and Convening

- Plant or maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at City Hall or another prominent or culturally significant community location.

Borse Community Park, our largest park in the Village (208 Midway Dr, Willowbrook IL 60527). The pollinator garden is going to be to the south/southwest of the playground . There will be a little path for people to walk through before they get to the playground area. In addition, all of the native plantings that we did for the shoreline restoration around the creek are also pollinator plants. That corner is just under an acre so I would guess all the restoration work would be around quarter of an acre. I attached the plant list so they can see all the pollinator plants that were planted in the area. In addition, the south side of Midway Park got planted again this fall with plugs and seed to help that pollinator garden that did not grow last year. That area is about a ¼ acre.

What community organizations, groups, or leaders (if any) did you partner with or engage to complete this effort?

None, though we expect to work with schools and girl/boy scouts groups on programming once the project is completed.
