We live in an area that is surrounded by the Laguna Madre Bay on the east, the Laguna Atascosa on the North, protected lands on the west and protected lands on the south(the Bahia Grande flats). We are proud that our community is rich with natural habitats which native flora and fauna and our goal is to preserve this habitat around us.

What resources have been most helpful to you thus far and what new resources would you like to see to help meet your goals? What resources would be useful to help expand equitable engagement in community processes and access to high-quality, usable nature?

Your newsletters and emails keeps us up with the national trends of helping to meet our goals conserving and adding monarch habitat but helps us as a community in keeping and preserving our surrounding habitat. I feel that the information I receive from the Mayors Monarch Pledge Programs helps us with our goals.

What else should we know about your monarch butterfly conservation efforts over the last year?

We engaged with a local eagle scout who project is to establish two butterfly gardens. One at our Rolrk ad one at thenoff Pa Laguna Vista Public Library. We are working with the CaraCara Trails program which connects nature trails with others in the Rio Grande Valley Region. We are working on a group of Master Gardener's who specialize in butterfly and nature centers to help us with our nature trails. The Town of Laguna Vista voted in making our official town tree the La Retama Tree that attracts butterflies as well.
