## Pledge Summary

The Borough of Glen Ridge is located in Northern New Jersey with a population of approximately 7,500. Numerous organizations, schools, and individuals in Glen Ridge have launched projects to support monarchs and pollinators, including planting pollinator gardens at Clay and Benson Street parks, Freeman Garden, and our schools, selling Penstemon digitalis at our 2025 Arts and EcoFair, and registering properties to be part of Glen Ridge's "Pollinator Pathway" program.

## Action Items Committed for 2025

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. A talk was also given at the end of the event by a trained naturalist on the importance of fireflies.
