Egg Harbor City New Jersey is a city of 4300 residents. We have planted many community gardens and wish to commit to monarch and pollinator conservation by planting a butterfly garden and educating the public.

## Action Items Committed for 2025

### Systems Change

- Integrate monarch butterfly conservation into the city's Park Master Plan, Sustainability Plan, Climate Resiliency Plan or other city plans.

### Communications and Convening
