Pledge Summary

The City of Northglenn is located just 15 minutes north of Denver, CO with approximately 39,000 residents. The city has committed to protecting nature, as noted by being a Tree City USA for over 34 years. To further the City of Northglenn's commitment for preserving our city parks, trails and open spaces, the city has committed time and resources into saving the monarch butterfly and other pollinators with the signing of the Mayor's pledge, pollinator friendly plantings and annual resident education and engagement.

Action Items Committed for 2025

Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Engage with community garden groups and urge them to plant native milkweeds and nectar-producing plants.

Program and Demonstration Gardens

- Host or support a native seed or plant sale, giveaway or swap.
- Plant or maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at City Hall or another prominent or culturally significant community location.
- Launch or maintain an outdoor education program(s) (e.g., at schools, after-school programs, community centers and groups) that builds awareness and creates habitat by engaging students, educators, and the community in planting native milkweed and pollinator-friendly native nectar plants (i.e., National Wildlife Federation's Schoolyard Habitats program and Monarch Mission curriculum).
- Initiate or support community science (or citizen science) efforts that help monitor monarch migration and health.
- Add or maintain native milkweed and nectar-producing plants in gardens in the community.
- Display educational signage at monarch gardens and pollinator habitat.

How are you leveraging the Mayors' Monarch Pledge program to engage marginalized communities, such as low-income communities or communities of color?

Our pollinator and Monarch Butterfly conservation efforts strive to have the pollinator gardens in prominent areas that are accessible by all communities within our diverse city. The pollinator garden at Fox Run is through the heart of one of our open spaces that is immediately adjacent to neighborhoods of diverse income and communities of color. The Fox Run Open Space is also directly adjoined to the RTD train line system and Northglenn station. This allows for immediate and direct access to low-income residents. Our pollinator garden at EB Rains Jr Memorial Park is in the heart of our city and directly adjacent to public transit, dense housing, and multistory apartments that house many of our marginalized community groups of immigrant, disabled, low-income, and communities of color.

What was your community's motivation for taking and continuing to work on the Mayors' Monarch Pledge?

Our Mayor, Meredith Leighty, directly advocated requesting our community's participation in the Mayor's Monarch Pledge. Her desire to see a resurgence in pollinators and support the Monarch butterfly's migration propelled our city's multi-department and community groups partnerships.

What resources have been most helpful to you thus far and what new resources would you like to see to help meet your goals? What resources would be useful to help expand equitable engagement in community processes and access to high-quality, usable nature?

One of our most successful resources were community groups that were already interested in citizen science, garden groups, and local conservationists that were looking for ways to plug into their passion for pollinators. Leveraging this pledge gave permission to fully connect and leverage those partnerships.

What else should we know about your monarch butterfly conservation efforts over the last year?

We want to thank the National Wildlife Foundation and the Mayor's Monarch Pledge for helping us to focus on real, practical strategies that can become part of our standard operating procedures (SOPs) for how we can be more thoughtful and protective of pollinators. While we directly engaged 225 people in the hands-on work or programs noted in this report, the City of Northglenn's pollinator gardens have reached an estimated 10,000 Northglenn residents and visitors.

Milkweed was maintained in several native vegetation areas throughout the city Greenway trail system. A new pollinator bed at EB Rains was added via a joint effort of our Water Quality department and Parks Department via a Resource Central - Pollinator Garden in a Box kit through it's grant program.
