Specific examples of these actions include maintaining a native plant garden at City Hall and replacing all landscaping along our downtown business corridor with native plantings. Mayor Flora is excited to continue these efforts and more by signing the Mayors' Monarch Pledge and doing what she can to help save the monarch butterfly.

We have yet to undergo a review specifically related to our municipal planting ordinances. However, we are going through a comprehensive zoning code update at the moment and landscaping is a component of this we are hoping to include incorporating milkweed in with any other proposed changes. Other actions taken include adding milkweed to our preferred plant inventory for our parks and included 15 individual plantings in one our newest parks that just opened.

The City has a robust invasive weed program. Each bed and native planting area throughout all City owned property (primarily in our parks) gets reviewed weekly with weed pulling and spot treatment as needed. We run this program all spring through the fall.
