## Pledge Summary

Hillsborough Township, located in Somerset County, is centrally located in the state of New Jersey with a population near 50,000. Hillsborough spans over 50 square miles and offers over 15 public parks through the municipality. Mayor Ciccarelli and the Township Committee have committed to supporting the Mayors Monarch pledge through action item projects accomplished throughout the town. Hillsborough's plans include to not only continue the beautification of its parks, but to also provide natural habitats for the monarch butterflies throughout the community.

## Action Items Committed for 2025

### Communications and Convening

- Issue a proclamation to raise awareness about the decline of the monarch butterfly and the species' need for habitat. This proclamation must incorporate a focus on monarch conservation.
- Launch or maintain a public communication effort to encourage residents to plant monarch gardens at their homes or in their neighborhoods. (If you have community members who speak a language other than English, we encourage you to also communicate in that language; Champion Pledges must communicate in that language.)
- Engage with community garden groups and urge them to plant native milkweeds and nectar-producing plants.
- Engage with gardening leaders and partners (e.g., Master Naturalists, Master Gardeners, Nature Centers, Native Plant Society Chapters, other long-standing and influential community leaders) to support monarch butterfly conservation.
- Create a community art project to enhance and promote monarch and pollinator conservation as well as cultural awareness and recognition.

- Plant or maintain a monarch and pollinator-friendly demonstration garden at City Hall or another prominent or culturally significant community location.

- Add or maintain native milkweed and nectar-producing plants in gardens in the community.

For years and still the case today, Neshanic Garden Club has always volunteered to maintain the Sensory Garden located in AVM Park. When the club learned that Hillsborough wanted to participate in the Mayors Monarch Pledge, the outpouring of support was unmatched. All Spring & Summer volunteers would assist in the planting of various new pollinator gardens throughout the community. When we hosted our Planting Demonstration, the Club provided equipment, educational material and even a guest speaker who was able to shed his knowledge on this topic. Additionally, we had contacted local nursery's encouraging them to sell specific milkweed pollinators, which many already did. They additionally were provided material on the Mayors Monarch Pledge to include at their places of business. Groups such as Belle Mead Co-op, Central Jersey Nursery, Bountiful Gardens and East Coast Natives.

Hillsborough hosted the "Save The Monarch Butterflies Poster Contest" for ages 18 and under. Children in Hillsborough had the opportunity to submit a poster to the Parks & Recreation office, with Hillsborough's summer camps also participating and creating posters. We ended with just under 100 submissions. At the end of the year 1-2 submissions will be selected to be in the 2026 Hillsborough Township Calendar. These posters were on display for a week in June, with additional Monarch & Pollinator information close by to give residents some additional information regarding this initiative.
