Please describe the extent of revisions or maintenance to invasive species removal programs, as well as the practices or techniques used to remove the invasive plants.

We are removing honeysuckle and pear trees in Woodlands Sports Parks and Jack Gettemeyer Park. In addition, we have developed a long-term plan to enhance the 3.2-acre Monarch butterfly habitat at 370 Lakeside Park. To support this effort, we mowed paths to divide the area into eight distinct quadrants to manage this area better. Currently, we are hand-cutting and treating unwanted vegetation in Quadrants 1 and 2, and we will brush-hog all quadrants this winter. Our goal is to renovate a few quadrants each year, recognizing that this will be an ongoing, annual process to continually improve and enhance the habitat over time.
